Munster Athletics Juvenile PRO Report - Track & Field Season 2014

Munster Championships

The Munster U/9 to U/11 Team Games & the U/12 & U/13 Track & Field Championships were held in Lee's Road, Ennis, Co. Clare on Saturday 7th & Sunday 8th June 2014. There were **8 new Championship Best Performances** ("CBP") being set & 1 equalled in the U/12 & U/13 age groups. Details of the CBP's are as follows:-

- 1. **Megan Lenihan, North Cork A.C.** threw 11.38m in the Girls U/12 Shot Putt to smash the existing record of 9.81m set by Ciara Sheehy, Liscarroll A.C. in 2013.
- 2. **Megan Lenihan, North Cork A.**C. threw 31.66m in the Girls U/12 Turbo Javelin to set a new record in this event improving on team-mate, Emily Linehan's 2013 record of 23.24m
- 3. **Niamh Foley, St. Mary's A.C., Limerick** set a new CBP in the Girls U/13 60mH when she won gold in a time of 9.60 to break her team-mate, Sophie Meredith's 2013 record of 10.01.
- 4. **Niamh Foley, St. Mary's A. C., Limerick** set another record in the Girls U/13 80m when she ran 10.40 to equal the hand-timed record of 10.40H held by A. Collins, Glenbower set in 1994 & bettered the existing electronic timed record of Sarah Lavin, Emerald A.C. of 10.48 set in 2006.
- 5. **Ciara Sheehy, Liscarroll A.C.** threw 12.39m in the Girls U/13 Shot Putt to break Sophie Meredith's record of 11.37m set in 2013.
- 6. **Reece Ademola, Leevale A.**C. ran 8.00H in the Boys U/12 60m to better the electronic time of 8.47 set by Colin Doyle, Leevale A.C. in 2012.
- 7. **Jack O'Connor, Dooneen A.**C. ran 1.44.00 in the Boys U/12 600m to better the existing record of Cian Daniels, Ferrybank A.C. of 1.44.71 set in 2005.
- 8. **Max Hallahan, Bandon A.**C. threw 27.30m in the Boys U/12 Turbo Javelin to break the existing 2013 record of 22.98m set by Michael Mulligan, Ferrybank A.C.
- 9. **Holly Meredith, St.** Mary's A.C. Limerick jumped 1.52m in the Girls U/13 High Jump to equal her sister Sophie's 2013 record.

There was a good turnout for the Juvenile U/9 to U/11 Team Games Competition & for the second year in a row, there was an individual dimension to these Championships in that medals were awarded for the first 3 teams & the first 3 individuals in each event. In the Team Games, Bandon A.C. was the top Club with 6 Munster titles, followed by Dooneen A.C. with 4 & Nenagh Olympic A.C. with 3 titles. There were also some very good individual performances on the day from our young athletes with 13 new CBP's being set

Old Records Fall in Cork

The Munster U/14 to U/19 Track & Field Championships were held in Cork I.T. on Saturday 28th & Sunday 29th June. The level of competition was very high with **20 new Championship**

Best Performances ("CBP") set, divided equally beween the girls & boys at 10 each. The majority of the records broken dated back to the 1980's & 1990's, a measure of the fabulous new emerging talent that we currently have in Munster.

The oldest record of the Championships to fall was the 1975 Boys U/18 Pole Vault of 4.08m held by L. Hennessy, Tipperary Town. Yuri Kanash, West Waterford A.C. bettered the 39 year old record by 12cm when he vaulted to a new PB of 4.20m. Next up was the Girls U/18 High Jump record of 1.70m set by Brid Golden, Ferrybank A.C. in 1986 & equalled by Patricia Naughton, Nenagh Olympic A.C. in 1990 which was broken by Nessa Murphy, Ferrybank A.C. who set a new record of 1.71m. Scott Gibson, Bandon A.C. set a new CBP of 49.72 in the Boys U/18 400m to sweep aside both the hand-timed record of 49.8H set by Danny O'Brien, Newport A.C. in 1988 & the electronic timed 51.34 set by Finbarr Horgan, Clonmel A.C. in 2007. In the Boys U/15 200m, Tony Odubote, Ennis Track A.C. set a new CBP of 23.78 to better the hand-timed record of 23.8H set by Diarmuid McCarthy in 1994 & the electronic time of 23.84 set by Gerard Minihane, Skibbereen A.C. in 2005. Adam King, Iveragh A.C. absolutely smashed the Boys U/18 1996 Hammer record of 58.66m held by Michael Grace, Tipperary Town A.C. when he threw 69.98m. In the Boys U/19 100mH, Sam Healy, Leevale A.C. ran 14.26 to smash both the hand-timed 1998 record of 14.4H held by Brendan Bourke, Kilmallock A.C. & the time of 15.93 held by Eoin Synnot, Emerald A.C. set in 2011.

Grace McKenzie, Belgooly A.C. won the Girls U/19 High Jump with a new CBP of 1.70m to better the existing 1998 record of 1.65m held by Orna Donoghue, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. Kelly Ann Doyle, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. set a new record of 1.02.33 in the Girls U/18 400mH to better the hand-timed record of 66.00H by Olive Burke, Limerick Emerald set in 1988. In the Girls U/19 Discus, Kaleigh Cronin, Farranfore Maine Valley A.C. set a new CBP of 41.23m to break the existing 2001 record of 39.66m held by Gillian Austin, Borrisokane A.C. In the Boys U/15 250mH, Tony Odubote, Ennis Track A.C. set his second record of the Championships with his 33.44 run to better both the hand-timed record of 34.2H set by Gerard Tobin, Clounalour in 2001 & Michael Quilligan's (Nenagh Olympic A.C.) electronic timed run of 34.50 set in 2011. David Cussen, Old Abbey A.C. was in form jumping 2.07m in the Boys U/19 High Jump to smash the existing record of 1.96m held by Christopher Crowley, Belgooly A.C. since 2005. In another Jumps event, Darren Prout, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. set a new record in the Boys U/18 Triple Jump when he leaped out to 13.58m to better the existing 2006 record of 13.47m held by Niall Counihan, Dooneen A.C. Orlaith O'Brien, Ferrybank A.C. won the Girls U/16 Javelin with a new CBP of 43.03m to smash the existing record of 34.70m set by Claire Fitzgerald, Tralee Harriers A.C. in 2006. Clodagh O'Mahony, **Dooneen A.C.** won the Girls U/18 100m Hurdles in a time of 14.41m to set a new record, improving on the 2006 record of 14.43 held by Mairead Murphy. Maria Carey, Newport A.C. leaped out to 12.06m in the Girls U/17 Triple Jump adding a massive 1m & 21cm onto the existing record of 10.85m set by Aoife Bartley, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. in 2008. Miriam Daly, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. set a new record of 11.73 in the heat of her Girls U/14 75mH race to

better the existing record of 11.76 set by Ciara Giles Doran, Ferrybank A.C. in 2008. In the Boys U/17 100mH, Jack Murphy, Leevale A.C. ran 13.83 to improve on the electronic timed record of 14.12 held by fellow Club member, Edmond O'Halloran set in 2008. In the Girls U/19 Pole Vault, Megan O'Connor, West Waterford A.C. vaulted her way to victory with a new CBP of 2.91cm adding 1cm onto the existing record of 2.90m held by Nikita Savage, Youghal A.C. set in 2010. Gearoid McMahon, Shannon A.C. set a new CBP in the Boys U/15 2000m Race Walk with his time of 9.49.09. This improved on the existing 2011 record of 10.25.08 held by Aaron Egan, Clonmel A.C. In the Girls U/17 Steeplechase, Aoife Hamilton, West Waterford A.C. set a new record of 7.49.99 to break the 2013 record of 7.56.27 set by Ciara Cummins, Nenagh Olympic A.C. in 2013.

AAI Championships

Clean Sweep for Emerald Girls

The Woodie's DIY AAI Juvenile Inter-Club Relays were held on Saturday 5th July in Tullamore Harriers Stadium. **Emerald A.C.** had great performances in the Girls competition winning National titles in Girls U/15 4 x 100m, Girls U/16 4 x 100m & Girls U/17 4 x 100m. **Leevale A.C.** Boys U/14 had an outstanding run in their 4 x 100m race setting a new Championship Best Performances ("CBP") with their time of 50.18. The strongest Munster Clubs on the day were **Leevale A.C.** (4 gold & 4 silver), **Emerald A.C.** (3 gold) & **Dooneen A.C.** (1 silver & 1 bronze), **St. Mary's A.C. Limerick** (1 gold), **Midleton A.C.** (1 silver), **Ennis Track A.C.** (1 silver) & **Waterford A.C.** (2 bronze).

AAI Juvenile "B" Track & Field Championships – 45 medals for Munster

The GloHealth National Juvenile "B" Track & Field Championships took place in Tullamore Harriers Stadium on Saturday 12th July 2014. A tally of 45 medals was won, 21 Gold, 13 Silver & 11 Bronze. Confined to 2 events on the day, many of Munster's athletes excelled winning medals in both their events. There were **four new Championship Best Performances** set on the day, 3 in the sprints & 1 in the 600m. The honours went to **Rachel Walsh, Carrick-On-Suir A.C.** in the Girls U/14 100m when she ran 13.32 to better the 2012 record of 13.68 set by Rachael Moriarty, Lios Tuathail A.C. The second record was set by **Roisin O'Callaghan, Midleton A.C.** in the Girls U/15 100m when she ran 13.43 to improve on the 2011 time of 13.48 set by Lisa Cooke, Mullingar Harriers AC. Our third record was set by **Aimee Hayde, Newport A.C.** in the Girls U/12 600m when she ran 1.48.23 to shave almost 5 seconds off the 2012 record of 1.53.20 set by Lara Gillespie, Enniskerry A.C. **Tracy Olugbue, Midleton A.C.** also ran a Championship Best Performance of 11.30 in the heats of the Girls U/13 80m which bettered the 2011 record of 11.31 set by Maeve Power, St. Mary's A.C. Limerick.

4 National Combined Events Titles for Munster

The GloHealth National Juvenile Combined Events Championships took place in Tullamore Harriers Stadium on Saturday 2nd August 2014. In very wet & difficult conditions, Munster athletes won 4 gold medals & National titles, 2 silver medals & 2 bronze. Three Munster athletes, **Sophie Meredith, St. Mary's A.C. Limerick, Vickie Cusack, Liscarroll A.C. & Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** all added National Outdoor titles to the National Indoor golds they won earlier this year in AIT Arena. They are also Indoor & Outdoor Munster Combined Events Championships in their age groups so it has been a very successful year for all three.

Sophie Meredith, St. Mary's A.C. Limerick took gold in the Girls U/14 Pentathlon winning on 2806 points with **Fiona Doyle, Star of the Laune A.C.** in 3rd place with 2603 points. **Joseph McEvoy, Nenagh Olympic A.C.** took gold in the Boys U/14 Pentathlon finishing on 2456 points with **Brian Lynch, Old Abbey A.C.** in 2nd place on 2439 points. There was also a gold medal win for **Vickie Cusack, Liscarroll A.C.** in the Girls U/15 Pentathlon which she won with

2893 points. In the Boys U/16 competition, Munster athletes scored a clean sweep of the medals with gold for **Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** (3791 points), silver for **Diarmuid Clancy, Abbey Striders A.C.** (2809 points) & bronze for **Sean Broderick, Youghal A.C.** (2790 points).

The SIAB Schools U/17 Track & Field International took place in the Cardiff International Sports Stadium, Wales on Saturday 19th July 2014 with Munster athletes winning **7 individual medals in total (3 gold, 3 silver & 1 bronze).** There were gold medal wins for **Kevin Mulcaire, St. Flannan's College/Ennis Track A.C.** in the Boys 3000m (8.36.76), **Jack Murphy, Christian Brothers Cork/Leevale A.C.** in the Boys 100mH (13.55) & **Aaron Egan, Clonmel High School/Clonmel A.C.** in the Boys 3000m Walk (12.59.52).

Silver medal were won by Maria Carey, St. Mary's Newport/Newport A.C. in the Girls Triple Jump (12.10m), Orlaith O'Brien, Ursuline Waterford/Ferrybank A.C. in the Girls Javelin (45.10m) & Yuri Kanash, St. Augustine's College, Dungarvan/West Waterford A.C. in the Boys Pole Vault (4.03m). Daniel Ryan, Thurles CBS/Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C. won bronze in the Boys Long Jump (6.77m).

In the Relay competitions, **Sharlene Mawdsley, St. Mary's Newport/Newport A.C.** won silver with the Irish Girls 4 x 100m Relay team.

Historic Win for Irish Celtic Team

The 2014 Celtic Games were held in Morton Stadium, Santry on Saturday 9th August. Hosted by Athletics Ireland, it proved to be a historic occasion for Ireland whose athletes performed a clean sweep of the seven Celtic trophies emerging as best overall country on the day. Ireland had a tremendous competition finishing 1st overall on 184 points with Wales in 2nd place on 150 points & Scotland in 3rd place with 136 points. An integral part of the Irish team was our 16 Munster athletes that lined out for their country & our 10 athletes that formed part of the Irish Development Team. 19 individual medals in total (7 gold, 8 silver & 4 bronze) were won by Munster. 3 Munster athletes also set new Celtic records on the day, namely Orlaith O'Brien in the Girls U/16 Javelin, Kelly Ann Doyle in the Girls U/18 400mH & Daniel Ryan in the Boys U/16 100mH & the Mixed U/16 4 x 100m Relay.

There were gold medal wins for **Orlaith O'Brien, Ferrybank A.C.** in the Girls U/16 Javelin (45.03m) CPB; **Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** in the Boys U/16 100mH CBP 13.58; **Kelly Ann Doyle**, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. in the U/18 Girls 400mH CBP 62.85; **Maria Carey**,

Newport A.C. in the U/18 Girls Triple Jump who equalled the Celtic Record of 11.98m; Clodagh O'Mahony, Dooneen A.C. in the U/18 Girls 100mH (15.43); Scott Gibson, Bandon A.C. in the U/18 Boys 400m (48.44); Juri Kanash, West Waterford A.C. in the U/18 Boys Pole Vault (4.15m); the Irish Mixed U/16 4 x 100m Relay Team (Daniel Ryan) 45.42 CBP & the Irish U/18 Boys 4 x 400m Relay Team (Michael Quilligan) 3.18.79.

Laura Cussen, Old Abbey A.C. had a 3rd place finish in the U/18 Women's Pole Vault (2.60m) with Sean Collins, Ennis Track A.C. placing 4th in the U/18 Men's 2km Steeplechase.

In the Relay competitions, **Daniel Ryan** was part of the Irish Mixed U/16 4 x 100m Relay team who won gold in a new Celtic Record time of 45.42, **Jenna Bromell, Kelly Ann Doyle & Aoife Delargy, Templemore A.C.** won silver with the Irish U/18 Girls 4 x 400m Relay, **Michael Quilligan** was on the winning U/18 Boys 4 x 400m Relay team.

Our athletes on the Irish Development Team also performed strongly with silver medals for Sharlene Mawdsley, Newport A.C. in the Girls U/18 200m, Fiona O'Shea, Dooneen A.C. in the Girls U/18 Triple Jump & Tony Odubote, Ennis Track A.C. who was on the Mixed U/16 4 x 100m Relay team.
