# Munster Juvenile PRO Report

### Foley & Ryan Lead the Way at National Indoors

Day 1 & 2 of the Woodie's DIY AAI Juvenile Indoor Championships took place in the AIT International Arena, Athlone on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> & Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> March. Top medal winners for the province were Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C. & Niamh Foley, St. Mary's A.C. who won 6 gold medals & set 4 new Championship Best Performances between them. There were only 3 athletes nationwide who achieved treble gold, the 3<sup>rd</sup> athlete being Elizabeth Morland, Cushinstown A.C. Ryan took gold in the Boys U/16 60m, 60mH & Long Jump setting records in the 60mH & Long Jump & Foley won treble gold in the same events in the Girls U/13 competition setting records in the 60m & 60mH. Sophie Meredith, St. Mary's A.C. Limerick & Louise Shanahan, Leevale A.C. won double gold each, Meredith in the Girls U/14 Long & High Jump & Shanahan in the Girls U/18 400m & 800m. Phoebe Murphy, Clonmel A.C. also won double gold in the Girls U/17 60m & 200m setting a new CBP of 24.66 in the 200m & achieving the qualifying time for the European Youth Olympic Trials. Two other double gold medal winners were Sam Healy, Leevale A.C. in the Boys U/19 Long Jump & 60mH & Grace McKenzie, Belgooly A.C. in the Girls U/19 High Jump & Long Jump. Perhaps a unique sibling medal haul was achieved by the Meredith sisters, Sophie & Holly from St. Mary's A.C. Limerick & the Ryan brothers, Daniel & David from Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C. who took home 10 medals between them (7 gold, 2 silver & 1 bronze) & set 4 National records with the Meredith sisters taking 3 gold, 2 silver & 2 CBP's & the Ryan brothers 4 gold, 1 bronze & 2 CBP's.

Among the 25 records set over the weekend, 13 outstanding performances & National Championship Bests were achieved by the following Munster athletes:-

- 1. **Gearoid McMahon, Shannon A.C.** won the Boys U/15 Walk in a time of 4.20.29 to break the existing record of 4.23.84 set by Martin Manning, St. Joseph's A.C. in 2002.
- 2. **Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** won the Boys U/16 60mH in a very swift time of 8.14 to smash the 1996 record of 8.36 set by Conor McPhillips, DSD.
- 3. **Daniel Ryan Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** won gold in the Boys U/16 Long Jump with his jump of 6.58m which added 1cm to the existing record of 6.57m set by Luke Sweetman, Fingallians A.C. in 2003.
- 4. **Darren Prout, Carrick-On-Suir A.C.** added 2cm to the Boys U/18 Triple Jump record with his jump of 13.96m to break the existing record of 13.94m set by Niall Counihan, Dooneen A.C. in 2007.
- 5. **Paul Murphy, Ferrybank A.C.** took the National title in the Boys U/19 400m when he ran 48.96 to take the existing record of 49.7H held by Tomas Coman, Templemore A.C. set in 1997.
- 6. **Megan Lenihan, North Cork A.C.** won the Girls U/12 Shot Putt with a throw of 10.20m to smash the 2012 record of 9.13m held by Theresa Kelly, Brow Rangers A.C. by over a metre.
- 7. **Niamh Foley, St. Marys A.C. Limerick** took the National title in the Girls U/13 60m in a super fast time of 8.10 to break the 2004 record of 8.2H held by Ellen Crotty, Brothers Pearse A.C.
- 8. **Niamh Foley, St. Marys A.C. Limerick** took gold in the Girls U/13 60mH with her time of 9.58 to better the existing 2011 record of 9.77 held by Molly Scott, St. Laurence O'Toole A.C.
- 9. **Holly Meredith, St. Marys A.C. Limerick** won gold in the Girls U/13 High Jump with a leap of 1.51m to break Vickie Cusack's 2012 record of 1.50m.

- 10. **Ciara Sheehy, Liscarroll A.C.** won the Girls U/13 Shot Putt with a throw of 11.95m to break the existing record of 11.48m set by Tracey Bradfield, Bandon A.C. in 2005.
- 11. **Sophie Meredith, St. Mary's A.C. Limerick** set a new record in the Girls U/14 Long Jump with her jump of 5.39m adding 5cm onto the existing record of 5.34m set by Ann O'Shea, Ferrybank A.C. in 2008.
- 12. **Alex O'Neill, St. Cronan's A.C.** took the title in the Girls U/15 800m with her time of 2.16.48 to smash the 2013 record of 2.19.77 set by Emer O'Shea, Navan A.C. in 2013.
- 13. **Phoebe Murphy, Clonmel A.C.** took gold in the Girls U/17 200m in a time of 24.66 to take the existing record of 24.84 held by Ciara Giles Doran, Ferrybank set in 2011.

#### **Hurdles Review**

Munster dominated the Hurdles event at the National Championships. Only two new National records were set in the Hurdles races over the weekend, both of them by Munster athletes - Niamh Foley, St. Mary's A.C. Limerick (Girls U/13) who ran 9.58 to break the existing 2011 record of 9.77 which was held by Molly Scott, St. Laurence O'Toole A.C. & Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C. who ran 8.14 to smash the existing 18 year old record of 8.36 set by Conor McPhillips of D.S.D in 1996. There was a 1,2,3 for Munster in the Girls U/18 race with gold for Leanne Prout, Carrick-On-Suir A.C., silver for Clodagh O'Mahoney, Dooneen A.C. & bronze for Kelly Ann Doyle, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. Other gold medal winners for the province were Daniel Hurley, Old Abbey A.C. in the Boys U/13, Miriam Daly, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. in the Girls U/14, Jack Murphy, Leevale A.C. in the Boys U/17 race, Jason Foley, Lios Tuathail A.C. in the Boys U/18 race & Sam Healy, Leevale A.C. in the Boys U/19 race. Silver medals went to Wymin Sivakumar, Leevale A.C. in the Boys U/13 race; Grace McKenzie, Belgooly A.C. in the Girls U/19 race, Darragh Courtney, St. Brendan's A.C. in the Boys U/14, Shane Monagle, Tramore A.C. in the Boys U/15 & Chloe Tobin, Emerald A.C. in the Girls U/16. Munster athletes also set 1 new Championship Best Performance when **Leevale A.C.** won the U/17 Boy's race in a super fast time & new National record of 1.33.16. National titles were won by **Nenagh Olympic A.C.** in the Boys U/13 4 x 100m Relay in a time of 54.89 & the Girls U/15 4 x 200m; **St. Mary's A.C. Limerick** in the Boys U/12 4 x 100m in a time of 56.01 & Girls U/13 4 x 100m in a time of 54.28 & Leevale A.C. in the Boys U/17 4 x 200m in a new CBP of 1.33.16 & Girls U/18 4 x 200m in a time of 1.43.71.
