Mawdsley Makes her Mark




The GloHealth Irish Schools Track & Field Championships took place in Tullamore Stadium on Saturday 4th June. Munster athletes were in fine form winning 34 individual Schools titles, 21 silver medals & 35 bronze & 7 sets of Relay medals (4 gold, 1 silver & 2 bronze). It was girl power all the way for Munster with our 4 double gold medal winners all being female. Sharlene Mawdsley, St. Mary's Newport took double School titles in the Senior Girls 100m & 200m with stunning performances & ran herself into the record books breaking Phil Healy's 2013 times of 11.83 & 23.98. Ciara Neville, Castletroy College powered her way home to very convincing victories in the Intermediate Girls 100m & 200m, Miriam Daly, Scoil Mhuire Carrick-On-Suir did a spectacular Hurdles double winning both the Intermediate Girls 80mH & 300mH with Megan Lenihan, Hazelwood College throwing magnificently to take gold medals in both the Junior Girls Javelin & Discus & breaking a 1975 Discus record of 38.28m which she exceeded by over a metre with her throw of 39.56m. Munster Schools also captured 4 out of the 8 Irish School Cups for top scoring schools in their age categories. It was a double win in the Minor section with St. Flannan's Ennis winning the Girl's title & Mercy Mount Hawk Tralee taking the Boys title. In the Intermediate section, two Tipperary schools won the honours with the Girls' title taken by Scoil Mhuire Carrick-On-Suir & Thurles CBS taking the Boy's title. In the Junior Girls category, Coláiste Treasa Kanturk & **St. Augustine's Dungarvan** were 2nd & 3rd with **Thurles CBS** taking 2nd place in the Junior Boys & **Bandon Grammer School** finishing 2nd overall in the Senior Boys competition.



Munster had 6 Record breaking performances from its athletes:-

- Sharlene Mawdsley, St. Mary's Newport set two new records in the Senior Girls 100m & 200m. She ran 11.80 in the 100m to better the time of 11.83 set by Phil Healy, CNT Bandon. Later in the day she ran 23.62 in the 200m to break the 23.98 run by Phil Healy in 2013.
- Ailbhe Doherty St Flannan's Ennis ran 2:18.18 in the Minor Girls 800m to break the 2015 record of 2.24.83 set by Murphy Miller, Strathearn.
- **Megan Lenihan, Hazelwood College** set a new record in the Junior Girls Discus when she threw 39.56m to break the 1975 record of 38.28m set by Marita Walton, Loreto Kilkenny.
- Mervin Shalamba Mercy Mount Hawk Tralee ran 11.44 in the Minor Boys 100m to break the 2015 record of 11.65 held by Josh Pyper, Pres Bray.
- Mercy Mount Hawk Tralee took the Minor Boys 4 x 100m Relay title setting a new Schools record of 48.14 to better the existing record of 50.01 set by St. Michael's College, Dublin in 2015.

Girls steal the show at centenary schools championships

It was a case of the girls stealing the show on a day of glorious sunshine at the centenary GloHealth All Ireland Schools Track and Field Championships in Tullamore today (June 4).

Michaela Walsh (SM & P Swinford) won the Lar O'Byrne athlete of the meet award for winning the shot put senior girls' shot put in 14.91m and a new hammer record of 56.90m. She also led her school to the senior girls' team title.

Sharlene Mawdsley (St Mary's Newport) was equally impressive as she captured double gold in the senior girls' sprints in record time - Mawdsley won the 100m in 11.80 (-0.4 wind) and the 200m in 23.62 (-0.2) wind.

Not to be outdone was Ciara Neville (Castletroy College) in the intermediate ranks as she bagged triple gold - the 100m in 11.86 (-0.8), the 200m in 24.67 (+0.0) and a blistering anchor leg to nip the victory on the line. Another star in the girls' sprints was Patience Jumbo Gula (St Vincent's Dundalk) who won the 100m in 12.28m (-0.9) and 200m in 25.35 (-1.7).

Star of the boys' sprinters was Aaron Sexton (Bangor Grammer) who set a new intermediate record in the 100m of 10.86 (+1.3) and took gold in the 200m in 21.85 (-0.3).

In the junior girls' discus Megan Lenihan (Hazelwood College Dromcollogher) bettered Marita Walton's 41-year-old record of 38.28m with a stunning 39.56m.

Sarah Healy (Holy Child Killiney) was different class in the U16 girls' mile with a new record of 5:03.57.

There was an impressive intermediate girls' pole vault record by Ellie McCartney (Belfast HS) of 3.60m ahead of Emma Coffey (St Angela's Cork) 3.20m and Clodagh Walsh (Davis College Mallow) third in 3.00m – all three bettered the record set by McCartney last year of 2.95m.

Jordan Hoang (Colaiste Choilm Tullamore) hop, skipped and jumped out to 14.35m to win the Olympic trophy in the senior boys' triple jump ahead of Shane Joyce (Ashbourne CS) in second in 14.07m and Ian Brennan (St Columba's Stranolar) in third in 13.57m.

Arlene Crossan (Loreto College Letterkenny) had a commanding victory in the senior girls' 400m hurdles in 60.87 – not far outside the record of 60.63 seconds.

Lucas Moylan (Patrician Newbridge) edged a high quality junior boys' high jump in 1.88m ahead of Nelvin Appiah (Moyne CS Longford) with 1.85m and Troy McConville (Lurgan Junior HS) with 1.79m.

Amy Rose Farrell (Mount Anville) stuck to the form books to win the intermediate girls' 3,000m in 10:15.99 - she pulled away from Abbie Taylor (St Gerard's) who was second in 10:17.73 in the closing stages.

Jack O'Leary (Clongowes) won a high quality senior boys 5,000m in 14:54.65. Ailbhe Doherty (St Flannan's Ennis) attempeted an ambitious double in the minor girls' - after winning bronze in the 100m in 12.43, she won the 800m in 2:18.18 in record time.

It was a fascinating day of competition with multiple records and 120 events which was run with precision timing from 9am to 6pm.
