Strong Showing from Munster Athletes on Day 1



Munster athletes showed good form at Day 1 of the Irish Life Health National Juvenile Track & Field Championships in Tullamore on Saturday 8th July 2017 winning **70 medals in total which included 28 gold & national titles, 24 silver & 18 bronze & 6 new National records** set by the athletes below:-

- 1. **Harry Nevin, Leevale A.C.** ran 11.04 in the Boys U/14 75mH to better the record of 11.46 held jointly by Ryan Murray, Bree A.C. (2011) and Cian O'Connell, Lake District A.C. (2015).
- 2. **Amy Whelan, Liscarroll A.C.** threw the Girls U/14 Javelin out to 41.53m to better the 2016 mark of 39.07m set by Megan Lenihan, North Cork A.C.
- 3. **Aimee Hayde, Newport A.C.** ran 2.15.63 in the Girls U/15 800m to beat the long standing 2005 record of 2.16.34 set by Ciara Cronin, Ferrybank A.C.
- 4. **Shane Monagle, Tramore A.C.** ran 14.18 in the Boys U/18 110mH to take Shercock A.C. Garbhan McKenna's 14.36 record set in 2013.
- 5. Laura Nicholson, Bandon A.C. ran 6.58.38 in the Girls U/18 Steeplechase to smash
- 6. the existing record of 7.20.70 by Ciara Cummins, Nenagh Olympic A.C. set in 2014.
- 7. **Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** ran 14.48 in the Boys U/19 110mH to smash the existing record of 15.09 set by Jack Murphy, Leevale A.C. in 2016.



Munster had two double gold medal winners on the day with **Daniel Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** claiming double gold in the Boys U/19 110mH and Shot Putt setting a new CBP of 14.48 in the

hurdles and **Kate Taylor, St. Cronan's A.C.** also claiming double gold in the Girls U/19 100mH & Long Jump. Other double medal winners were **Sophie Meredith, St. Mary's A.C.** who won gold in the Girls U/17 Long Jump & silver in the Shot Putt with gold for **Sean Carolan, Nenagh Olympic A.C.** in the Boys U/17 Discus and silver in the Long Jump. **Wymin Sivakumar, Leevale A.C.** was also another double medal winning taking silver in the Boys U/16 100mH and Long Jump with **Vickie Cusack, Liscarroll A.C.** winning gold in the Girls U/18 Long Jump & bronze in the Shot Putt. A unique achievement on the day was a gold medal win for **Theo De Souza, Carraig na BhFear A.C.** in the Boys U/12 Long Jump which he added to his Dad and Grandad's National athletics medal collection, a three generations span of winnings for Carraig na BhFear A.C. Siblings who recorded wins were **Andrew and David Scanlon, Waterford A.C.** who both won bronze medals, Andrew in the Boys U/12 Shot Putt and David in the Boys U/13 High Jump with **Daniel and Jack Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** both taking gold in the Boys U/19 and Boys U/17 Shot Putt competitions.

Juveniles shine on day 1 in Tullamore

Juveniles shine on Day 1 in Tullamore

The juveniles, much like the sun, were shining in Tullamore on Day 1 of the Irish Life Health Juvenile Championships.

There was a host of new championship best performances set along with some great competition.

In his last summer as a juvenile, Daniel Ryan (Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.) set a new championship best and record in the boys U19 110m Hurdles with a time of 14.48 seconds and later went on to win the shot put with a best of 14.47m.

There was an impressive javelin throw in the U14 girls with a new record by Amy Whelan (Liscarroll) of 41.53.

The teak tough Aimee Hayde (Newport) ground down Ailbhe Doherty (Ennis Track) in the U15 girls' 800m to win in a new championship best of 2:15.63. Doherty had to settle for silver on this occasion with 2:18.96.

There were a number of good 800m races – amongst them was Molly Brown (MSB) winning the U17 girls in 2:16.64 and Louis O'Loughlin (Donore Harriers) powering to victory in the U17 boys in 1:55.71

Craig Giles (Clonliffe Harriers) and Conor O'Driscoll (Leevale) were tactically impressive in their respective U18 and U19 800m races. Giles struck gold in 1:56.61 with O'Driscoll winning in 1:57.22.

Laura Nicholson (Bandon) won the U18 2,000m steeplechase in 6:58.38, smashing the old best of 7:20.70 by Ciara Cummins. Alannah Neff (Leevale) in second was also well under the old record with 7:09.94.
