19 Medals for Munster at SIAB Schools International



The SIAB Schools U/17 Track & Field International took place on home soil in Morton Stadium, Santry on Saturday 15th July 2017 with Munster athletes taking home 13 individual medals in total (1 gold, 5 silver & 7 bronze), almost double their medal tally from last year (7) and 6 Relay medals (1 gold & 5 bronze). There was a gold medal win for **Darragh McElhinney, Colaiste Phobail Bheanntrai** in the 1500m when he ran 3.59.2. **David McInerney, Hamilton High School** also won gold in the 100m Non-Scoring race on the day with a time of 11.37.

Miriam Daly, Scoil Mhuire COS, the Irish Girls' team Captain, took home silver in the 300mH in a time of 44.62 and was also part of the Irish Girls 4 x 300m that won bronze. Silver medals were also won by Aimee Hayde, St. Mary's Newport in the 1500m (4.33.99), Megan Lenihan, Hazelwood College in the Discus (40.22m), Caitlin Kennedy, St. John the Baptist Hospital in the High Jump (1.71m) and Liam McDonagh, Thurles CBS in the 3km Walk (14.58.07). Bronze medals went to Ailbhe Doherty, St. Flannan's College Ennis in the 300m (40.31) and 4 x 300m; Jo Keane, St. Flannan's College Ennis in the 800m (2.12.19), Ciara Kennelly, St. Brigid's Killarney in the High Jump (1.67m), Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville in the Shot Putt (14.76m), Sophie Meredith, SMI Newcastlewest in both the Long Jump (5.85m) and the Triple Jump (11.20m) and Sean Mockler, Thurles CBS in the Discus (50.13m). Several of our Munster team were also Junior athletes (Ailbhe Doherty, Caitlin Kennedy, Megan Lenihan, Aimee Hayde, Ciara Sheehy & Adam O'Dwyer) with a few years left yet to compete in this competition so the future is bright for Munster. Some schools also had multiple athletes competing at these Championships with Thurles CBS numbering 4 (Jack Ryan, Sean Mockler, Liam McDonagh and Adam O'Dwyer), St. Flannan's College Ennis 2 (Ailbhe Doherty & Jo Keane), PBC Cork 2 (Conor Morey & Colin Doyle), SMI Newcastlewest 2 (Sophie Meredith & Niamh Foley) & St. Mary's Newport (Aimee Hayde & Sean Carolan). 5 of our athletes were just outside the medals with 4th places recorded by Niamh Foley, SMI Newcastlewest (200m 25.27), Emma Coffey, St. Angela's Cork (Pole Vault 3.31m), Jack Ryan, Thurles CBS (Shot Putt 14.24m), Ben Donovan, Midleton College (High Jump 1.90m) & Colin Doyle, PBC Cork (100m 11.29 and 200m 22.68).



In the Relay competitions, **Miriam Daly and Ailbhe Doherty won** bronze with the Irish Girls 4 x 300m Relay team (2.43.77), **Niamh Foley, SMI Newcastlewest** won gold with the Irish Girls 4 x 100m relay team (45.63) & **Conor Morey, Colin Doyle and Dave McInerney, Hamilton High School** won bronze with the Irish Boys 4 x 100m Relay team.



In the Girls competition, Ireland scored 203 points to finish 2nd behind England (254) with Wales in 3rd (118) and Scotland 4th (105) while in the Boys competition, Ireland were 2nd overall on 163 points behind England on 258 points with Wales 3rd on 163 points and Scotland in 4th place on 124 points.
